Where the Rubber Meets the Road

GOD LOVES YOU SO MUCH ...

Dr. J. Vernon McGee

The words of John 3:16—arguably the most well-known verse in the Bible—are simple. In fact, most of the words you read in the Gospel of John are so simple a child can read them, but they are also so profound that I wonder if any one of us really knows what they mean.

In the original language, John 3:16 reads, "loved God the world." Greek sentence structure places the important part of the sentence first—the *love* of God.

Jesus communicated this simple, profound truth in a conversation with a man named Nicodemus. But often missed are two verses that come before John 3:16, and they help us to more fully understand. Let's go back and read them:

And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. –John 3:14, 15 FOR Jod so loved THE WORLD THAT HE GAVE HIS ONLY BEGOTTEN SON, THAT WHOEVER believes IN HIM SHOULD NOT PERISH BUT HAVE word astrong life.

John 3:16

Jesus calls Nicodemus' attention to something he is very familiar with—an event in the Old Testament during Israel's 40 years in the wilderness. (See Numbers 21:9). Jesus said that

Moses lifted up the serpent, "Even so *must* the Son of Man be lifted up." The "must" corresponds to the "must" our Lord said earlier to Nicodemus—"You must be born again." Since Nicodemus *must* be born again, then the Son of Man *must* be lifted up. The necessity of being born again makes imperative the lifting up of Christ on the cross. It is a divine compulsion.

With this picture, our Lord threw open the doors of heaven for Nicodemus (and for us), and we see the King of Glory—not enthroned and crowned, but on a cross. Jesus Christ reveals His death on the cross to Nicodemus three years before He died. Clearly and definitively, this is why He came; He came to die.

May I get personal? I am going to heaven someday. You may think, "Well, you must be very good." On the contrary, I am not very good. I am going to heaven someday because of this one truth: Christ died for me, and I trust Him.

We have not adequately scaled the heights, plumbed the depths, or grasped the width of the love of God. Paul was accurate when he said, "To know the love of Christ which passes knowledge" (Ephesians 3:19). We are not able to measure the vastness or the intensity or the overwhelming goodness of God. If you could, it would break your heart, just as it would mine. I can only say that God loves you.

These are days in which a great many people are called to go through dark nights and deep waters. When you face problems and face them alone, you need to know that God loves you. Whoever you are, wherever you are, God loves you, and His love is revealed in Christ on the cross. And, my friend, you will find it only there. It is not on the mountaintops or on the surging sea; it is not in babbling brooks or majestic redwood trees—you will not find it anywhere in nature. The Bible makes this crystal clear. "God so loved the world that He gave redwood trees and babbling brooks"? No! "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

Will you believe?

MY TURN

RIGHT NOW, THIS MINUTE, TAKE THIS TO HEART:

He loves you so much He gave His Son for you.

Because He loves you, He's made a way for you to have a relationship with Him through His Son, Jesus Christ, who lived a perfect life and died on your behalf to pay the punishment for your sin.

Without God's gift and Jesus' sacrifice for you, you can't ever know God. Your sin separates you from Him, and you can't do anything to bridge that gap. Your sin condemns you, and you can't do anything to help yourself.

But God has made a way for you through Jesus Christ. His death pardons you from being condemned. His sacrifice can give you life-and not just a better life here and now, but a life in God that goes on forever.

But you must decide for yourself. There's only one thing to do: Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ. Trust Him to forgive your sin and be your Savior.

To know Jesus Christ as your Savior is what life is meant to be. The peace and joy you can experience now is just a taste of what's ahead, after you breathe your last breath here. That's when real life begins.

ON BEHALF OF MILLIONS ...

I often wish I could come to your home, sit in your living room (hopefully while sharing a cup of coffee!), and share the things I witness happening at *Thru the Bible* on a regular basis. As a listener to the program, you know Steve and I try to offer a taste of that experience, but we are always limited to just a few minutes of sharing.

The first thing I would say to you is "thank you" on behalf of millions of people around the world who wait eagerly each day for the next program in their journey through the Word of God. Many of these people live in a kind of poverty that would stretch your imagination. Most have very little formal education, and some are illiterate. Others come from very dark backgrounds, like a listener I met in Nepal who used to be a witch doctor. Many are set free from bondage in idol worship and dark religious practices. Many listeners have turned to Christ from Muslim backgrounds. Numerous Imams (Muslim clerics) have secretly listened to *Thru the Bible* in their language and joyfully turned to Christ.

People suffering in horrific conditions in prisons around the world find comfort, hope, and strength by listening to *Thru the Bible*. One man I met in India who was a gang leader found Christ listening to *Thru the Bible* in prison. He was released for good behavior and now pastors a number of churches. A successful businessman in Saudi Arabia came to faith in Christ watching our Arabic satellite TV program and had everything taken from him. They confiscated his money, sentenced him to 100 lashes in public, and put him in prison. He began leading many to Christ in that prison and later escaped the country. He is ministering to hundreds he has led to Christ after his release.

A significant portion of our audiences suffer for their commitment to Jesus Christ. We hear accounts of people being disowned by their families, fired from their jobs, imprisoned, and questioned by the authorities. The most surprising thing we hear from those who are persecuted is that they do not ask us to pray for it to stop. They ask us to continue to give them the Word of God so they can be encouraged, strengthened, and honor Jesus Christ.

and go about my ways. Some have become friendly simply because I do not react and continue to serve those in need. Please prav for them: they need God's peace, and they do not know it. And please continue to teach God's Word. I study and pray every day, hoping it will keep me close to Him."
