Where the Rubber Meets the Road

THE GOSPEL OF ACTION

Dr. J. Vernon McGee, as summarized in the Bible Companion for the Gospel of Mark

One of the first New Testament books to be written was the Gospel of Mark. Though John Mark was not an apostle, he traveled with Paul and his uncle, Barnabas, on the first missionary journey. By far, John Mark's closest relationship was with Simon Peter. This Gospel has long been considered Simon Peter's account, as told to John Mark. Some have said the facts of the Gospel are from Peter and the explanations are from Paul.

John Mark specifically wrote this Gospel for the Roman mind the strong man who ruled the world for a millennium. The Romans brought a forced peace to the world with its strong dictatorship and—with it—justice, good roads, law and order, and protection. In the days when the Caesars ruled, the world longed for mercy and all they got was power. No man dared resist it, and fleeing the realm was impossible. It was in that day God sent a message to the Gentile world through the writer, John Mark.

Considering Peter as the source, no wonder the Gospel of Mark is a Gospel of action. Peter was that kind of man. The Lord Jesus here lays aside His robes of royalty that we saw in Matthew and girds Himself with the towel of service. Jesus is the King in Matthew and the Servant in Mark—God's servant. The style of this shorter Gospel is brief and

blunt, pertinent and pithy, simple and sweet, stripped of all excess verbiage. Mark goes right to the point, to the point of action and accomplishment. He answers the question: "Can Jesus do the job?"

Early in this Gospel we watch the intensity of Jesus' ministry unfold. There's probably more content in this first chapter of Mark than any other chapter in the Bible. It covers the ministry of John the Baptist, showing how he fulfilled the prophecies of Isaiah and Malachi. It follows Jesus through a busy Sabbath, demonstrates His authority over the demonic realm, and finishes with a mighty work of healing. Yet, despite the pressure of a busy life, Jesus still took time to pray—getting up before dawn to be alone with His Father.

More than any other name, Mark calls the Lord, "Jesus"—His common name. He then tells us about when Jesus (the second person of the Godhead) is baptized and comes out of the water. The Spirit of God (the third person) comes like a dove upon Him and a voice out of heaven, God the Father, says, "This is my beloved Son." The Trinity sets heaven's seal upon Jesus as God's Son, ready for ministry. Immediately (one of Mark's favorite words), the Spirit drives Jesus into the wilderness for initiation. Remember the question Mark wanted to prove was, "Can Jesus do the job?" Other men couldn't stand up under temptation. Adam didn't make it. Noah failed miserably after the flood. Abraham failed. Moses and David did, too. Will Jesus?

So, for 40 days Satan tempted Jesus, and He did not fail. We'll never know the depth of the pain He suffered in this wilderness, but we do see that after it was over, animals (below Him) and angels (above Him) ministered to His needs.

After the temptation, the Lord moves directly into ministry, specifically with works and words that illustrate the Servant, preaching the gospel of God, saying the kingdom of God is at hand. "Repent and believe the gospel." As Jesus begins His ministry in Galilee, He calls His disciples. Most of them fishermen, they leave their nets and follow Him into a busy life of ministry.

By His teaching,

Historical evidence shows demonism was rampant throughout the entire Roman Empire during Jesus' ministry years. Mark intentionally records the miracle of casting a demon out of a man first because it was over the spiritual realm where only God can control. Mark proved Jesus' credentials—His authority in His teaching and the demonstration of power only God has. The people couldn't understand, but the demons recognized Jesus right away.

This is the beginning of the gospel. By His healing, He got people's attention and proved His authority over the physical and demonic realm. By His teaching, Jesus prepared people for salvation through His death and His resurrection. His teaching will not save us; it is only through His death for us on the Cross that we can be saved.

THE EARLY YEARS OF RADIO IN AFRICA

Ray Alary remembers the days when he served THRU the BIBLE in his role at Trans World Radio.

"It is the third Sunday night of the month. I'm living in South Africa, packing my two suitcases with just two items: rice and cooking oil. My routine is the same every month. I'll spend a week with my TWR team in Zimbabwe. Life is difficult there, to say the least, so I do my best to make sure our small team has something to eat.

"Thru the Bible has been the cornerstone of radio ministry to Zimbabwe for almost 30 years. In the darkest days it was many people's church, also the Bible school for lay pastors who had no formal training. When the country didn't have electricity (often), it was the light in total darkness. When most operations shut down, our offices stayed open. Listeners wrote to say that in spite of hardship, they could endure because *Thru the Bible* was faithful in delivering the Word of God.

"If you've been on the Bible Bus for a long time, thank you for your prayer and financial support that allowed *Thru the Bible* to be a light when all was dark. **Your faithfulness has impacted generations. Please remain faithful so the people of Zimbabwe can hear the message of hope.**"

GODFREY, A LOCAL CHRISTIAN MAN IN ZIMBABWE SHARES:

"I still remember those days in 1982 when I carried our portable radio to the fields or attached to my hip while herding cattle and goats. I didn't want to miss all the programs on TWR. I dialed in 49 MB on shortwave in the morning and 90 MB in the evening.

"When we were herding goats and it was raining, we'd take shelter in the caves. I would still be listening to my favorite program, *Thru the Bible.* Some of the boys my age didn't find Bible teaching exciting and would rather listen to music on the radio. But not me. Somehow. I knew my journey of a thousand miles

"My radio routine not only changed my life, it shaped my life. *Thru the Bible* was my greatest source of encouragement when God called me into ministry as a pastor. I hope to one day sit down with someone at TWR and relive those good, golden days.

In the first century community of believers, picture the faithful meeting together in homes. In Jerusalem, the early church met in a large home owned by Mary, possibly the sister of Barnabas who traveled with the apostle Paul. Her son, John Mark, was likely led to the Lord by Peter. This young man, Mark, recorded Peter's eyewitness testimonies of Jesus' life and ministry. He wrote this, the shortest Gospel, specifically for Roman readers, for the strong men.

"For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." –Mark 10:45

"In Mark's Gospel, Jesus lays aside the regal robes of kingship and girds Himself with the towel of service. He is King in Matthew's Gospel; now He is God's Servant." –Dr. J. Vernon McGee

Jesus' work pictured in the Gospel of Mark was always for a larger purpose and always on the move. Jesus' time on earth was short, and there was a lot to get done.

Mark records 19 miracles illustrating Jesus' power and compassion. He was the true God and a true man. People responded to Jesus with awe, amazement, and fear.

The word "immediately" occurs 40+ times.

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus' greatest acts of service pointed people to His death and resurrection as their Savior. **Only through faith in Him can we be saved.**
